Ever since Melanie Fierbaugh has been announced as our new pastor there has been an air of expectation and anticipation. We look forward to the gifts and talents that she will bring to our congregation. However some have had a bit of a struggle with having a female pastor to lead us. Those who have this concern have lifted up I Timothy 2:8-15, which among other things says that "women should learn in silence and not be allowed to teach or have authority over men." I suppose that it is natural that this should come to me since I have done a lot of teaching here at our

church and since I have a daughter who is a pastor. And I'd would like to give my interpretation of this question.

Sometimes in the Bible there are a couple different ways of looking different topics. For example if you just look at Old Testament passages you will see that there is an emphasis on judgment rather than grace, which is a major theme of the New Testament. So it is possible to get a focus that might be out of balance, either to the judgment side or the grace side. I think that we have a somewhat similar situation when it comes to women leading in the church. To understand this I think it would be best to start with the Biblical idea of a prophet or prophetess. First, it is important to realize that as far as the duties of a prophet or prophetess there is absolutely no difference between these two words. The difference between the two words is only there to match with the gender of the person that is being spoken about. Secondly, the idea of a prophet is that the prophet is to speak on behalf of God. This is the goal of a sermon that any pastor preaches. The idea is to represent God. So when we speak about a pastor, part of their duty is to be prophetic. Therefore if women were called in the Bible to be prophets then it stands to reason that they would share their prophecy with people, including the church. And of course there were a couple of women who served as prophets in the Old Testament; Miriam and Deborah. But the New Testament expressly opens up the idea of women serving as prophets by quoting the prophet Joel. In Joel (which is quoted in Acts 2:17-21) it says, "In the last days it will be, God declares, that I will pour out my Spirit upon all flesh, and your sons and daughters will prophesy and your young men shall see visions, and your old men shall dream dreams. Even upon my slaves, both men and women, in those days I will pour out my Spirit; and they shall prophesy." As Peter quotes Joel he says that this passage, that speaks about all God's people, both women and men, being given the Spirit so that they can prophecy represents the "last days," a time that many call the Church Age which is the time that immediately proceeds the second coming of Christ. The idea that women are also called is verified a little later in Acts when in Acts 21:8-9 where it is mentioned that the evangelist Philip had four daughters who all have the gift of prophecy.

So why are there different ideas represented in the scripture from the idea of women being called to positions of authority? From reading the writings of people who were critical of the Christian movement of the first century it appears that the fact that women had a great deal of freedom in the first century church was appalling to many people of the Roman Empire. This was one of the major areas that Romans criticized the church. A reflection of the freedom that women had in the first century church can be seen in Galatians 3:26-28 which teaches that in Christ all the boundaries that used to stand between people, Gentile or Jew, male or female are no longer seen in the same way, for we are all one in Christ Jesus.

So how do we reconcile the words of I Timothy with the other passages of scripture that I have quoted? I don't know, but I can make a guess. I think that since there was so much criticism by outsiders of the freedom that women had in the church and one of the most important aspects of early church was evangelism, the book of I Timothy is saying to the women of Timothy's church "tone down your freedom so that we might attract outsiders and enable them to come to know Jesus Christ as their savior." So, the way I look at it, the Good News of Jesus gave all of us the freedom to be who we were gifted to be by the Holy Spirit, it doesn't matter if you are a man or a women. But because of our sinful nature there are times that Bible adjusts things to meet our failings, for example Jesus said that God never intended for a married couple to divorce, but since we are so broken there are sections of the Law that give instruction on divorce. I think that it is this way with women leaders in the church as well. We are all called but because of human sin there are times that they have been excluded. I think that in our days that we can move beyond our sometimes limited views of the call of God in people's lives and embrace all who are called to be what they have been gifted to be by the Holy Spirit.

I hope this helps your understanding.




