I have to admit, I find great joy in reading Scripture. I love reading scripture because every time I read it, I feel the presence of Christ. Sometimes I feel like I am sipping a cup of tea with a friend and listening to their heart. Sometimes I feel as if God has opened my soul and is pouring His healing oil directly into my heart. Other times I know I have come to hear the truth about myself, and something that I need to confess and seek repentance. I have at times felt like Holy Spirit was singing over me, blessing me with grace and spiritual gifts. Scripture can

be like a cold glass of lemonade on a hot July day, soothing my parched soul and perking up my spirit. How could I walk away from this book? It is alive. It is one place I go to meet with my Savior, hear straight from the Father, and encounter Holy Spirit. I am more of who God made me to be, more of who God is calling me to be, more like my Savior every time I read its precious pages. So, for me the Bible brings great joy. How is it with you?

I know that for some the Bible is difficult. They feel lost. They feel overwhelmed. They feel inadequate. Or some have even confessed that they feel bored when they read it. Don't worry, I think we have all felt these things at one time or another. First, these are not simply words on a page. These are sacred words that the Living God breathes into life, and through them He will speak to us. "Okay, Pastor, but give me the plain truth. How can I read the Bible and not feel this way?" In a word, expectation. Open your Bible the same way you turn to a friend at lunch and lean in to hear what God has to say. Expect God to speak. Pray and ask Holy Spirit to speak to you clearly. I promise, the more you pray and invite Christ to breathe life into the words on the page, the more you will hear and experience God.

I met with a friend for lunch today. When we sat down at the table, we leaned in close so we could hear each other speak over the din of the restaurant. We started our conversation exactly where we had left off the last time we spoke. We listened to each other intently while we talked. We laughed and enjoyed our conversation. We shared our hearts and comforted each other. We challenged each other a little. We encouraged each other. We stuffed a lot of love and connection into an hour. We left planning the next time we would have lunch.

What if you began to approach reading Scripture, just like having lunch with your friend? What if you leaned in close and bravely opened yourself to hear every drop of what God is saying to you? What if you let him give you joy, comfort you, encourage you, challenge you? What if you made a date for the next time you were to meet? What if you poured yourself a glass of lemonade, relaxed, and leaned into whatever the God who loves you wants to say?

The words in the Bible are not just words, they are truly "living and active." The Bible is the restaurant table where we go to meet our friend and Savior and listen close to every word He has to say. Because, trust me, Jesus loves you and will meet you in the pages of His book and you will leave better than you were before.
