Psalm 121 "I look up to the mountains—does my help come from there? My help comes from the Lord, who made heaven and earth! He will not let you stumble; the one who watches over you will not slumber. Indeed, he who watches over Israel never slumbers or sleeps.

The Lord himself watches over you! The Lord stands beside you as your protective shade.

The sun will not harm you by day, nor the moon at night. The Lord keeps you from all harm and watches over your life. The Lord keeps watch over you as you come and go, both now and forever."

I have to admit that my feet crave the cool soil of the Appalachian Mountains. I need to see and climb the mountains about once a year. I need to lose my shoes and walk on soft river rocks and enjoy the cool water on my feet. I love my Florida home, but sometimes I just need the mountains. As equally as I crave the physical mountains of the Appalachians I also crave the spiritual mountains of my past: Emmaus, Seedbed Conference, Jamaican Missions, Cuban Missions, Habitat Houses, and many many others. I draw from the lessons and energy learned from God in those mountain seasons to sustain my soul during seasons where I am obviously not on a mountaintop. However, here is where I have to caution my own soul. The experience (the mountain) was not the source of the spiritual power enjoyed, only the LORD is my source of help, protection, and power. Only the LORD. I cannot equate Emmaus with the power and presence of the LORD. However, I need to remember that I encountered the power and presence of the LORD at Emmaus and walked away changed. Further, the work that the LORD did in my soul in the mountains of Jamaica is not limited to that mountain. The same spiritual mountaintop experience enjoyed in Jamaica can be known today if I seek the LORD God who made the mountains. The same God who empowered me to preach boldly in fresh ways in Cuba also stands guard over me at night and even as I shop at Publix. God is equally at work in the valleys as well as the mountains. So, although my soul craves the next mountain, the question stirs in my soul: "Am I willing to see God in the valley as well?" Will I listen and cooperate with the perfecting grace of God in the more mundane, flat portions of my life? I want to shout: "Of course!" But in reality I am not consistent in this practice. I need to remember the mountains and let their song of remembrance and encouragement sweep over me, reminding me that God is powerful and on the move. Will you seek God in the mundane places of your life and wait for His timing to bring you to the next mountain? Will you allow the power of God to wash over you as you seek to hear from God no matter where you are? I can crave a mountain, but I cannot worship the mountain. It was my relationship with the Creator that gave me the mountaintop experience, not any other human factor. Will you join me in worshipping the God who created the mountains and trusting in God to keep watch over me while I am in battle and while I am on the battlefield? I am praying for you all, and I love you very much.


