# Take the Prayer Challenge!

When I was a little girl I was an acolyte. We used real candles and it was my job to light every candle and then sit in a tiny pew on the chancel beside my Father, who was the pastor. I loved the Sundays that I was an acolyte. I arrived early with my Father and I helped him unlock the buildings, turn on the lights, and then we would go into his study. Dad would review his notes and tell me jokes, and then we would pray. I would listen to my Dad ask the Spirit to fill his words and the people. I would hear him pray for the hurting, hungry, and hated in the community. That's right the hated, rejected, and outcast were always heavy on his heart.

Those prayers changed me. In many ways, Dad's prayers are still changing me. It is easy for me to pray for those whom I love. It is even easy for me to pray for the people other people love. What is not easy is for me to pray for people who make my skin crawl, or fill my belly with rage, or who are oppressive, or angry, or hurtful. Lord, do I really have to pray for those people? And yet Jesus says in Matthew 5:44: "But I say to you, love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you..." A curious thing began to happen in my Father's ministry, God began to send people that no other church wanted, the people who were hated, rejected, and outcast. Miracles began to spring up as well. These people, whom God loved, began to receive His love and find redemption, hope, and healing. Those years of faithful prayer planted seeds in the spiritual realm that bore great fruit. All because he prayed for the hurting, hungry, and hated in his community.

How is your prayer life? Do you pray for the hurting, hungry, and hated in our community? Or do your prayers only include blessings for yourself and the people you love. What if you began to echo the prayer that my father prayed, the kind of prayer that Jesus told us to pray? What if for the next 30 days you prayed for the hurting, hungry, and hated in our community? I am going to journal my prayers for the next 30 days and see what seeds God plants in my heart, our church, and in the spiritual realm. Will you join me?

## Children's Ministry News

New things are coming to the Clubhouse and Nursey! We are starting up a new game plan during the children's church hour, that's the time during the 10:45 Worship Service. The new schedule will have the kids moving to a different rotation each week by their age group. Each Sunday we will need about 10 adults helping at once. Not all help needed is teaching. We have many different opportunities, some as easy as providing food or loving up the kids. Here is the list of ways you can volunteer to help:

- Breakfast Crew 4 to 5 people needed; Sunday School is being moved to Rob Reynolds.
   The breakfast crew is responsible for providing breakfast for the kids and also setting up and cleaning up the table.
- Worship Leader- Once the children return from the 10:45am Worship Service, we will start our worship time off with the Worship Leader leading the kids with 3 sets of praise songs.
- Clubhouse Shepherds—The Clubhouse Shepherds are responsible for their grade level.
  They will move to each rotation with the kids. They will also take attendance each Sunday and send out "we miss you" cards when kids have missed more than three Sunday's in a row. 4 people are needed.
- Lesson Team—There are many different options to pick from when it comes to picking a
  place to serve on the lesson team. Being on the lesson team means you will teach one lesson over the course of a few weeks. Month to month changes with the amount of time
  each lesson will take.
- Nursery Team—The Nursery is also changing into a rotation schedule. The Nursey will be
  a bit different but a team of three people including Ms. Martha will be needed.
- 45 Zone Team—(4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> graders Sunday School) Scott & Sally Durban are the leaders
  at this time but are hoping to have more helping hands involved. It's set up with a curriculum.

I know this seems like a lot but we want to make a difference in the lives of the kids Jesus has blessed us with. Start planting the faith! It will cost us our time, energy and maybe even a little patience but I know in the end we will see a big difference in the lives of all involved. #### **Altar Flowers**




Wouldn't you love to see real flowers on the altar again? There is a calendar in the back hallway across from the restrooms on the church bulletin board to sign up
